Beaumont Shop Safe Pledge

Beaumont, CA— The City of Beaumont is launching a new initiative with the aim of keeping the community safe from the spread of coronavirus by asking local businesses and retailers to take the “Beaumont Shop Safe Pledge” to implement a number of precautions designed to protect both employees and customers.

Among the measures are abiding by all state issued industry guidance, enhanced cleaning protocols, wearing face masks, and practicing proper physical distancing. Businesses who take this pledge will receive a poster that can be displayed to assure customers of all the steps taken to ensure their health and the health of employees.

In addition, the city will post a list of businesses on its website that have agreed to sign on to the pledge.

“As we move through the State’s Resilience Roadmap, it is important that we remain diligent about stopping the spread of the COVID-19,” said Mayor Rey Santos. “This pledge will show that our local businesses care about the health and well-being of our community and our visitors who come to patronize our shops.”

Beaumont Shop Safe Pledge:

- Abide by all orders and directives issued by governmental and public health officials.
- Enhance sanitization efforts including disinfection of high-touch surfaces.
- Require the use of face coverings by staff and customers per CDC guidelines.
- Require frequent handwashing for all employees.
- Require workers with a fever or flu-like symptoms to stay home.
- Practice physical distancing.
- Provide general COVID-19 awareness training for all employees.
